The Basic Preparation Curriculum is a 5-day educational and personal growth retreat, designed to prepare registered nurses to deliver wholistic care in congregations. It is developed within an interfaith model, recognizing and incorporating a diversity of belief systems for faith-based nursing. Recognized by the International Parish Nurse Resource Center, it is offered annually in South Florida through a partnership between Interfaith Health & Wellness Association and the Christine E. Lynn College of Nursing at Florida Atlantic University.

Parish Nurse Reflection

The majority of the population at St. John of the Cross in Vero Beach that I serve as a Catholic Charities Wellness Nurse is over 55 years of age. With the help of our outreach worker, Pat Dimesa, we have built a volunteer base to assist with health education, advocacy, transportation, respite, and as Eucharistic ministers. A "Seniors Helping Seniors" fund was also started to provide financial assistance to those in need for electricity, medicines, and other basic expenses. A food bank has been set up in the Parish Center with non-perishable food items and is run by volunteers. Flu and health clinics were held last Winter. We also have held Health Fairs and are planning on holding the American Heart Association's "Power to End Stroke" and 9-week "Search Your Heart" class on the importance of nutrition and exercise.

One client I visit is an elderly man who lost his vision many years ago. He has only one nephew in the area (an accountant) who takes care of his finances but doesn't have much time to help him with some of the other daily areas of his life. Each time I visit him, I check on his overall wellness. We also pray together. Not everyone will seek prayer but the strength and hope that we receive from this encounter goes beyond sight. My client also looks forward to someone from the Church visiting him and helping him with his selection of books on tape that come from the Bureau of Braille.

Another client I have visited is an 88 year old with a diagnosis of diabetes. I was able to reinforce what he learned from his dietician and give him meal suggestions that would match his preferences. I spent extra time with him to explain the use of his glucometer and today this client has a complete understanding of his diabetes and the self-care needed to maintain health.

Our clients have varied needs and are of diverse backgrounds. They are all given the same respect and consideration, and in their own way give back more to the nurses than they could imagine.

Faith Community Nurse Volunteers at Your Congregation

A new and unique community service is now offered by Hospice of Palm Beach called the Faith Community Nurse Program. The goal is to provide a faith-based registered nurse within congregations to promote holistic health and wellness utilizing the Parish Nurse Scope and Standards of professional practice.

- Service is uniquely designed for each faith community.
- Education, advocacy, prayer, screenings, wellness and counseling are offered.
- Services are complimentary, not a substitute for current medical care.

Lisa Shoemaker, RN, BSN, was hired by Hospice of Palm Beach to take on this new role. Mentoring closely with Gae Faraone of Holy Name of Jesus Church in West Palm Beach and Abbi Bentz of Temple Beth El in Boca Raton, Lisa has begun contacting the network of faith community nurses in South Florida to volunteer one day a week for six weeks. She asks the established faith community nurses how she could help them, and for new congregations interested in beginning a health ministry, she offers support in conjunction with Interfaith Health & Wellness Association.

Lisa is already scheduled to work with St. Paul Episcopal in Delray Beach, Christ Fellowship in North Palm Beach, the Jewish Community Center and First Presbyterian in West Palm Beach.
