Palm Healthcare Pavilion's new Pre-diabetes and Diabetes Education Research Center (behind St. Mary's Medical Center) 5202 Greenwood Avenue, West Palm Beach, is offering free glucose screenings during the month of November, 8:30 am and 9 am, Monday –Thursday, for people in Palm Beach County and Medicare recipients.

Free workshops and classes are also offered in the Apartment for Caregiver Education and Health Professions Simulation Center, Healthy Kitchen, and state-of-the-art Conference Center, in addition to comprehensive care provided to children with special healthcare needs and their families.

Wellness Lectures for Family Caregivers and Community; Introduction to Caregiving: Your Role in Preserving Health & Wellness; Household & Kitchen Safety; Safe Mobility and Transfers; Managing Incontinence; and Living Healthy with a chronic condition are just some of the courses open to the public and presented in cooperation with community partners.

Faith Community Nurses Lead “Living Healthy” Self Management in Belle Glade

“Living Healthy”, Stanford University’s evidence based chronic disease self-management workshops, results in positive health outcomes for participants when the program is implemented as designed. “Many of the participants have multiple health conditions and this workshop gives them the tools and skills to manage their condition such as better breathing, relaxation techniques, communication with their health provider, positive thinking, better nutrition, and flexibility, endurance, and strengthening exercises.”

Two parish nurses from Belle Glade, Florida have implemented the 6-week “Living Healthy” workshops for local residents.
